"Behind the Scenes"

Our wonderful Casavant pipe organ turned thirty years old this Summer. It has served this congregation so well over the decades, yet it has been in need of some major work for a while now. We are so grateful to be able to start a two-phased process to restore and even improve this marvelous instrument as we prepare it to continue to serve as the backbone of the music ministry at Galloway.



In this first phase, memory level was added to the computer components of the organ. This enables we organists to save more of the combinations of sounds we use for various effects in different types of music. Many organists play the Galloway organ. We host guests for our Advent and Lenten Lunchtime recital series. Also, several students take lessons on the Galloway organ each week (I teach two students in-person and one organ student in Colorado on Zoom, and Bob Knupp also occasionally teaches his students here). We need a lot of room for each organist to save their work. We now have that room! We went from having had 16 levels of memory to 256!!! It's going to make each organist's work here so much more convenient!




In addition to this, we have added a "piston sequencer," which is sort of like an organist's "easy button." It will enable all organists to very quickly and easily move through the stop changes of even a very complicated piece with the tap of a toe or the push of the thumb. The great concert organists of the world these days seem to almost all LOVE to play on organs with these "sequencers." We are now ready for them to come play at Galloway!

Of the four keyboards on the Galloway organ, the top keyboard never had the ability to add a warm vibrato or "tremolo" to its beautiful solo flute or its powerful "cornet" (a French stop-- pronounced *core-nay*). I am THRILLED to say that we now have this tremulant added to the wind chest.. It fluctuates the compressed air so that it goes into the pipes unevenly and comes out with a warm and even more beautiful sound than before, much like the vibrato of a fine singer. The difference it has made is really stunning!




Other important work included the replacing of old and cracking wiring and cables to keep the organ safe and lasting another three decades or more.





I give special thanks to Casavant Freres Organ company for coordinating and subcontracting Ben Hoskins to come here for a week from his organ business in Des Moines Iowa to do this work. He did a fine job indeed. Please enjoy seeing the pictures of the organ as it was in various states of work!

We will sing beloved carols and classics by Finzi, Willcocks, and more; accompanied with orchestra.





SPOTLIGHT ON BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. Many charitable organizations hold campaign events each year to increase awareness and raise money for research into its cause, prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and cure of this disease. According to the Susan G. Komen organization, 1 in 8 women will be diagnosed with Breast Cancer within her lifetime. That is 1 person every 2 minutes in the United States. The two most common risk factors are being born female and getting older. In 2022, it was estimated that 44,000 people in the United States will die from Breast Cancer.

Important considerations for all women include the following:

Knowing Your Risk

Learn about your family history and talk to your doctor to see how your family history impacts your risk of getting Breast Cancer.

Getting Screened

For women at average risk, have a mammogram starting at age 40. Finding and treating Breast Cancer early may save your life.

Knowing Your Normal

It is important to know what normal is for you, so that anything looking or feeling different may be discussed with your doctor.

Making Healthy Lifestyle Choices

Living a healthy lifestyle may lower your Breast Cancer risks. Maintaining a healthy body weight, limiting alcohol, and exercising regularly are all factors that matter when it comes to your overall health and risk of disease.

Taking Action

Participate in fundraising efforts by walking or running in one of the many events held each year promoting Breast Cancer Awareness. If you are unable to participate physically, sponsor someone who is walking or running.

While most common in women, men may also get Breast Cancer. Although it is rare, older men are susceptible, and their risk increases with age. Male Breast Cancer is most often diagnosed in men in their '60's. Men with a family history are at an increased risk of the disease. The same considerations for women are considerations for men when it comes to Breast Cancer.

Early detection and effective treatments are crucial in reducing Breast Cancer deaths. Thought to Ponder: Knowing what is normal for our bodies is the first step to being and staying healthy. Seeking medical advice when something seems abnormal is vital to maintaining good health.
